CACs at a Glance

From time to time, the Board of Trustees or the Administration may request the input of CACs or a particular CAC.

But on a regular basis, the main function of the CAC is to provide input to the principal. The principal is ultimately responsible for campus-level decisions, and the CAC enables the principal to make informed decisions.

The DAC and CACs are not unique to AISD. Every public school district in the state is required to have them.

According to the state law (Texas Education Code, Subchapter F), CACs are required to annually: Provide input on the campus budget, assist in the development and monitoring of of a Campus Improvement Plan (CIP), and review the state-issued “Campus Report Card”.

In addition to these statutory requirements, the CAC provides input on any topics or issues deemed necessary or appropriate by the principal.

State law requires CACs to have membership that include parents, teachers, and community members. But the law does not specify how many of each, or how long they serve. The specifics of CAC membership and other aspect of CAC operations are addressed in district policy BQB(Local) and CAC bylaws.

CAC bylaws are developed by the Coordinator of District Advisory Bodies, in consultation with the DAC. Any questions or issues related to CACs are addressed by the Coordinator of District Advisory Bodies.

District policy BQB(Regulation) directs the Coordinator of District Advisory Bodies to annually conduct audits of a select number of CACs to assess their compliance with state and local requirements.
