Overall, Apex is a great event that many love, myself included, and its many aspects are a key element that make it so fun! \$\fomale{y}\$





All of the students gathered on April 8, 2024, at 1:32 pm around the soccer field to view the eclipse. I saw some kids bring picnic blankets, towels, pillows, or mats to sit on with their friends before the eclipse started. Everyone got a pair of solar eclipse glasses to safely view the totality, or peak, of the eclipse without hurting your eyes. Totality only lasted 1 minute and 46 seconds, but all of the students cherished it because the next eclipse will be August 23, 2044! That's 20 years! There are different stages of the total solar eclipse, though. The steps go from first contact, or a partial eclipse, to second contact, where the sky

darkens or birds stop singing, and next totality, where the moon fully covers the face of the sun, then third contact, which is the same thing as second contact but in reverse, and finally, fourth contact, where the moon uncovers the face of the sun.



First Grade Read Aloud: If You Plant a Seed by Kadir Nelson

Over one week in February, we went to five different 1st-grade classes and asked them about A book called *If You Plant a Seed*. The classes were Mrs. Farris's class, Mrs. Skalaban's class, Mrs. Farnsworth's class, Mrs. Garcia's class, and Cò Tracy's class. Then we asked the students two questions. The first one was; what is the message or moral of the story? The 2nd one was; what happened differently when the bunny was kind compared to selfish?

Asking the question; what is the message or moral of the story? A student in Mrs. Farris's class said "If you plant a garden animals will

eat from it." That is a fact, and that is not the moral of the story. A student in Mrs. Skalaban's class said "How to grow a garden." If this book has a moral then it is fictional not instructional. A student in Mrs. Farnsworth's class said "To be kind and share." DING DING DING that is correct, but that is just one part of the message. A student in Cò Tracy's class said "Planting seeds is fun." That might be true for some people but that is an opinion so that is not the message the book is trying to tell us. A student in Mrs. Garcia's class said "Don't be selfish" AHA! Could that be the missing piece? The book is trying to tell us to be kind, and not selfish.

Asking the question; What happened differently when the bunny was kind compared to selfish? A student in Mrs. Farris's class said "when you are kind you have fun and when you are selfish you get bored." That is true for some people but not everyone. A student in Mrs. Skalaban's class said "If you are kind, the seed will grow into something new." That is a good metaphor for what the story is trying to tell us, but not what happened in the book. A student in Mrs. Farnsworth's class said "When you are kind you get gifts, but when you are selfish you get nothing." That may be true in some cases but not always. A student in Mrs. Garcia's class said "When you are selfish you get tomato sauce on you and when you are kind you don't " If you are selfish then people might want to throw tomato sauce on you but I don't think they would actually do that. A student in Cò Tracy's class said "When you are kind people will be kind to you and when you


are selfish people will not be nice to you."That is exactly what the book is trying to tell us!
